

CYBER-ART HITS CENTRAL LONDON

Micha Klein is recognized as one of the world's leading artist working with computer graphics, and from his Rainbow Children exhibition in Cork Street it is easy to see why.

The Dutchman's works mix video, club culture, fashion, graphics and photography to create a dazzling array of digital art. This computer-generated art is concerned with club culture in Amsterdam and many of Klein's images feature DJ's and fashion models amusing themselves through drug taking and lesbian petting.

One particularly eye-catching feature of these images is the array of future fashions on display, which are elaborate to say the least.

The highlight of the exhibition though, is a video featuring dancing pills with smiley faces, which is accompanied by music from American rap music artist Eminem.

The virtual world in which the pills dance is full of colourful psychedelic images and the graphics are visually stunning.

Cork Street has never seen anything quite like this exhibition.
